

Bondi explorer

The 'blue' Bondi Explorer has 19 stops, taking you along a picturesque path through Sydney's affluent Eastern Suburbs, out to Watsons Bay and on to cosmopolitan Bondi Beach. Then, sit back and view the rugged coastline and golden sands of Tamarama, Bronte and Coogee Beaches. It's the perfect way to take in some of Australia's most famous coastline all year round, rain or shine.

All day, Every Day

This bus departs from Circular Quay every day at approximately 30 minute intervals, with the first departure at **8.45am**. The last 'round trip' leaves at **4.15pm** and will return you to Circular Quay at around 6.15pm. The 'blue' Bondi Explorer gives you the flexibility to get on and off anywhere along the 30 kilometre circuit. Just look for the distinctive 'blue' Explorer bus stops. The entire journey takes around 2 hours to complete if you stay on board.

And...

Our on board informative commentary details the routes highlights—the historic places, attractions and scenic venues. There's no need to book, just jump on board and buy your ticket from the driver. And, of course, your Bondi Explorer ticket lets you travel free on the regular Sydney Buses up to midnight on the same day, as long as it's in the circular route covered by the 'blue' Explorer Bus.

Note: Each Explorer has its own ticketing and the one day ticket is not transferable between the 'red' and the 'blue' Explorers.

The 2 day Twin Ticket allows you unlimited travel on both the 'red' Sydney Explorer and the 'blue' Bondi Explorer, over 2 days. These 2 days can be used non consecutively over an 8 day calendar period.

A child is defined as anyone from the ages of 4 to under 16 years (children under 4 travel free).

+ A family is defined as two adults and any number of children, from 4 to under 16 years of age, from the same immediate family.
